Taiwan is Retaking the Initiative with its New Southbound Policy

When Taiwan's President Tsai Ing-wen announced the New Southbound Policy aimed at reinvigorating and expanding ties with Southeast Asia and South Asia in 2016, some

domestic audiences saw this as no more than "old wine in a new bottle," a mere replica previous administrations' "Go South" policies. However, after two years in action, the New Southbound Policy has now proved itself to be, in CSIS China Power Project Director Bonnie Glaser's words, "more strategic and comprehensive" than any previous Taiwanese policies toward Asia.

Dyson's Choice of Singapore could See its Electric Cars Clean Up

Southeast Asian Percepetions of the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue
